THE E.R.A. FOLLIES OF 1979

NARRATOR: CONGRESSMAN GEORGE HANSEN, at a standing mike on or near the stage.

This evening we bring you, for the first time anywhere, the E.R.A. FOLLIES OF 1979. As we celebrate the expiration of the seven years set by Congress on March 22, 1972, it is fitting and proper that we be happy and enjoy this wonderful evening. You will have to be very quiet and listen carefully to the words, because they all have a message you will want to hear. We present: BILL AND PRUDENCE FIELDS singing "A WONDERFUL DAY LIKE TODAY."

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JOY AND LINDA PANTANA show us what life would be like for young women if E.R.A. had been ratified. ATTENSHUN -- NOW HEAR THIS:
"THE ERA MILITARY MARCH."

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One of the obstacles the Stop ERA ladies have had to cope with for the last few years is the financial contributions made to the ERA ratification efforts by PLAYBOY Magazine. The Illinois ladies discovered this when they found mailings going to State Legislators with the Playboy bunny postage meter imprint. Over the years, PLAYBOY has given thousands of dollars to ratify ERA.

Here comes BILL BILLINGS as "PLAYBOY COTTONTAIL."

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The women's lib leaders spend a large part of their time hating the Stop ERA ladies. I am sure the libs have compiled a list of Stop ERA persons they would like to bury underground if they ever got a chance. Our next number, with apologies to those great political satirists Gilbert and Sullivan, is presented by those three pretended libs, ANN McGRAW AND JOY AND LINDA PANTANA, singing "I'VE GOT A LITTLE LIST."

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Jimmy Carter showed his great understanding of women by appointing Bella Abzug to chair the Commission on International Women's Year, which spent \$5 million of your money.
