NARRATOR: Today, we celebrate the expiration of the Equal Rights Amendment: The End of an ERA -- the end of the seven-year period set by Congress in the original E.R.A. resolution passed on March 22, 1972. Let's identify the states that are marching tonight against the Equal Rights Amendment. We present the "March of the States!"

Leading the March are the 15 States that have NEVER ratified E.R.A., but have defeated it again and again and again for seven long years.

NARRATOR: Now we have the March of the five wonderful States where the people voted NO when E.R.A. was put on the ballot in a referendum. Those states include even big, liberal New York where the voters defeated E.R.A. by more than 400,000 votes.

NARRATOR: We believe that the Equal Rights Amendment dies tonight because the original E.R.A. resolution passed by Congress clearly specified the seven-year limit. The peculiar Time Extension Resolution which was allegedly passed last fall cannot be valid because it did not receive the 2/3rds majority that Article V of the Constitution requires. But just in case some court should bow to Jimmy Carter's pressure and declare the Time Extension Resolution valid, or rescissions invalid, we now call the March of those States whose E.R.A. ratifications will expire anyway because their individual ratification resolutions all separately contain the seven-year limitation. So, here is the March of the 30 States whose ratifications expire tonight.

Singing notes:

Note special pronunciations of some states.

Oklahoma should be sung to the notes of the song from the musical "Oklahoma."

Underscoring means hold the syllable for an extra beat.

- \* means a silent beat.
- Use the melody of the beginning of the recorded jingle, but I do not care for the latter part where it rather trails off with no melody or meter. I urge just repeating the basic melody over and over again. That is the way the "March of Stop ERA States" is written to be sung.
- Wisconsin is the only state where the accent isn't right; just emphasize the "Wis."
- The song should be arranged so that some states are sung by two women, some by two men, and some by all four.
